Biography

Steve Lin has concertized throughout the United States, Italy, the Philippines, and Taiwan. He is acclaimed by *Classical Guitar Magazine* as “a confident player with a powerful sound, quick hands, and a solid musical memory” and praised by American guitar virtuoso Eliot Fisk as a performer who “plays with an innate and uncommon elegance”.

Steve was the first prize winner at the 2006 Boston GuitarFest Competition and the 2001 East Carolina University Guitar Competition. He has performed at Mérida Yucatán Guitar Festival, Yale Guitar Extravaganza, L'Accademia Musicale Chigiana, Chitarralperia Festival, and Stetson Guitar Workshop.

A recording artist for VGo Recordings, Steve has released two albums. The first, *Eliot Fisk Series Vol. 1* (VG1013), is a joint effort with guitarist Joseph Williams II and La Bella Strings and was dubbed “innovative and exciting” by *Minor 7th Acoustic Guitar Music Reviews*. His second CD, *Imagen* (VG1015), features the Latin American compositions of Agustín Barrios and Antonio Lauro, which *Classical Guitar Magazine* called “brilliant” and “virtuosic”. A third CD is underway and will include new works based on Asian-American themes.

In addition to his work as a concert guitarist, Steve is regularly engaged in community and educational concerts. Beginning in 2005, he founded Boston Guitar Project, which organized over 20 performances annually, ranging from benefit concerts for disaster relief, music hours for nursing homes and hospitals, and fund raiser concerts for local non-profits throughout the Greater Boston Area. Now living in the San Francisco Bay Area, he continues his work through the South Bay Guitar Society and his own outreach initiative, reaching churches, libraries, and schools.

Passionate about new music, Steve will be commissioning new works from award-winning composers Lei Liang and Mu-Xuan Lin in 2009. These compositions will draw from Chinese classics such as *Dreams of the Red Chamber* and *Journey to the West*. Steve has also commissioned and premiered works by David McMullin, Nomi Epstein, Joseph Johnson, Matthew McConnell, and Colin Stack.

In 2008, Steve was coached by composer Helmut Lachenmann in preparation for a performance of ‘...zwei Gefühle...’, *Musik mit Leonardo* with Stephen Drury and the Callithumpian Consort. He has performed with Boston Microtonal Society’s *NotaRiotous*, a chamber ensemble dedicated to promoting microtonal music. He has also appeared at New England Conservatory’s *Summer Institute for Contemporary Performance Practice* (SICPP) and on the *New Gallery Concert Series* of Boston.

At present, Steve teaches guitar at San Jose State University. He is also a guitar instructor at Northern California School of Music and Canon Music School and maintains a private studio. Steve is completing his doctorate from New England Conservatory under Eliot Fisk. He earned his M.M. at Yale School of Music and his B.M. at NEC. His primary teachers have included Oscar Ghiglia, Lorenzo Micheli, Wei-Ren Chuang, Ronald Purcell, and Ronald Borczon. During his free time he enjoys spending too much time cooking and playing table tennis.

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Steve is regularly engaged in community and educational concerts. Beginning in 2005, he founded Boston Guitar Project, which organized over 20 performances annually throughout the Greater Boston Area. Now living in the San Francisco Bay Area, he continues his work through the South Bay Guitar Society.

Selected Workshop Topics

Musical Activism for Today's Musicians

One of the many hats that young musicians today will be asked to wear is performing in the community and engaging in educational programs. Some think of it as a form of community service, while others do it to inspire a new generation of listeners. The ways to take part in community and educational work are as varied as their objectives. Through community and educational work, a musician can build relationships with local institutions, apply for grants, interact with audiences, broaden your network, and even develop a career path.

Better Know Your Fret Board – A More Mindful Way to Practice Technique

A hands-on, guided technique session that will help guitar students become better acquainted with the fret board by combining theoretic rudiments with technical exercises. This implementation of concepts such as proper voice leading, modulation, and counterpoint with daily practice was developed by the American guitar virtuoso, Eliot Fisk, who dubbed it, "The Poetry of Technique"[™]. By being more mindful of the way we practice technique, we can also develop our aural skills, familiarity with the fret board, sight reading, and of course, technique.

Sight Reading for Guitarists

There is a very strong correlation between the *quantity* of repertoire a guitarist has read and the *quality* of his/her sight reading abilities. Sight reading a skill that can be trained much in the way one can train at a sport. We will identify potential pieces that we can use to work towards gradually developing better sight reading. This workshop will help you set up a routine that you can incorporate into your daily practice.

Lin gives brilliant renditions of this music; he plays with an instinctive intuition, his highly developed technique enabling him free rein with this highly virtuosic music.

The recording quality is good as is the presentation, although it would have been nice to have had a little more information about the player and the music.
